



Relevancy: Simulates the adrenalin dump a shooter may encounter during a deadly force engagement that requires precision accuracy with both the rifle and pistol. This evolution challenges the competitor's judgment in terms of the size of the target they chose and the shooters ability to make positive target identification.

Objective: Place accurate rifle fire on any or all of the three progressively smaller hostage target(s) based on the shooters skill level and confidence while under physical and mental stress from various shooting positions, and then transition to the pistol to engage dangerously close threats after making positive target ID.

Safety: Rifles are left at the rifle firing line at all times. Once all rifle rounds have been fired the shooter leaves his rifle in place on the rifle firing line and then moves behind the rifle firing line laterally to the pistol firing line where he must pick up the object at his/her barricade to shoulder height and drop same before he/she un-holsters their side arm to engage the pistol range targets. After the shooter finishes firing their pistol rounds they can not re-holster until instructed to do so. Failure to follow these instructions results in all pistol rounds being DQ'd. **MUZZELS MUST REMAIN POINTED DOWN RANGE AND BELOW THE BUREM AT ALL TIMES.**

Time: 3:00 minutes (Includes the run)

Ammo: 30 rifle rounds (Two magazines loaded with 15 rounds each or three magazines loaded with 10 rounds each) / 3 pistol rounds loaded in one magazine (Weapon is "hot" and holstered)

Target: Custom hostage targets on 8"x11" paper: Large is 100% (3.25"Wx 5"H) / Medium is 75% (2.5"W x 3.75"H) / Small is 50% (2"W x 3"H). One CMI Target ID for pistol target.

Start (Pistols will be pointed down range and made hot on command): The patrol rifle will be on the deck in the car carry position on the 35 yard line.

Step #1: On the command to go, time will start and the shooters must review the mug shot in their assigned target book for as long as they wish and then run to a pre-designated point (traffic cone) 50 yards behind the rifle firing line, and then back to their rifle making it hot and begin engaging their designated rifle targets in the following sequence:

- **10 rounds standing**
- **10 rounds kneeling or sitting**
- **10 rounds prone**

Step #2: Once all rifle rounds have been fired the rifle is left on the deck and the shooter moves behind the rifle firing line and laterally down the range (behind those still firing rifles) to their designated pistol firing range lane. Shooters may not un-holster their side arm while moving. To ensure safety the shooter must pick up the object on the ground in their designated pistol shooting lane, hold it shoulder height and drop it back to the ground prior to un-holstering their side arm. Once this is done shooters are to recall the mug shot they viewed at the beginning of the evolution, make positive target ID and engage that image with one pistol round each time it appears. Failure to follow these instructions will result in disqualification of your pistol rounds.
