Police Sniper Instructor School Confirmation Letter

All registered students should report to the Lansing PD Range no later than **0830hrs on Monday**, April 26th, 2010. Bring paper & pencil.

Monday's training schedule is classroom all morning, range in the afternoon & classroom in the evening. Ensure that you have clothing appropriate for the weather.

Expect the average day to last 10-12 hours. **Expect a night shoot on either day 2 or 3 of the course. Bring Lunch, dinner and ample water for each day of the school.**

Students should be in good physical condition as the stress of getting up and down hundreds of times during this school can take its toll on some officers.

Since this is an instructor course, it is **performance based**. This ensures your agency receives the best possible product. The standards for this course require that you pass the following phases:

- 1) **Assigned project:** Each student will give an in depth presentation on a subject assigned to them by the instructor. (approx. 5–10 minutes in length)
- 2) **Cold bore exam on days 2-4:** Must average 70% or better
- 3) **Written Examination:** 70% or better
- 4) **Qualification courses of fire:** You will receive 3 attempts to pass the qualification courses of fire. You must pass all phases in order to graduate.

If you pass each task you will graduate and receive a Diploma as a "Police Sniper Instructor". Failure to pass any one of these requirements will result in your receiving a certificate of attendance for "Advanced Sniper Training".

Course Description: This professional development school teaches the fundamentals of police sniper team leadership, organization, and how to provide safe and relevant police sniper training. The focus of this school is on instructor development, training organization and

execution, liability reduction, operational tactics, and advanced sniper topics such as, intermediate barriers, angle shooting, night vision and urban tactics using academic and practical teaching methods. Students should already be proficient snipers and must have attended a Basic Sniper School prior to attending this school. Graduates of this course will be able to instruct basic and precision rifle marksmanship to the police officer and make educated recommendations to the administration on deployment, equipment, & policy issues for the SWAT environment and Sniper Unit. Every graduate will have demonstrated proficiency in the weapons use from various shooting positions from 5 to 200 yards. Instructors will be exposed to moving targets, low light survival tactics and shooting, engagement of multiple adversaries, hostage rescue evolutions, judgment and scenario training, angle shooting if facilities allow, and intermediate barrier engagements.

Equipment Requirements: Sniper rifle (recommend .308) with quality scope, sling, binoculars and carrying case (pelican type case and drag bag). 600rnds of match grade ammunition, cleaning equipment to include a one piece rod, jags, solvent, and oil. Data book, 2 sets of BDU's w/boonie cap, camouflage gear and paint, cold/wet weather gear, flashlight w/red lens, duty belt, communications gear, hearing & eye protection, sun screen, insect repellent, glove for weak hand, lunch and plenty of water for each day.
